- If you have any present or past medical problems after any dose of Prevnar 13
- If you are sick with a high fever
- If you have any bleeding problems

As with any vaccine, Prevnar 13 will not protect 100% of those who receive the vaccine.

Streptococcus pneumoniae, the bacteria causing pneumococcal pneumonia, can be present in your body without causing any symptoms.

Even though you may not show any symptoms, you can still infect others.



Prevnar 13 helps your body make its own antibodies to help protect you against diseases such as pneumonia, bacteraemic pneumonia, sepsis and meningitis caused by 13 types of the bacteria *Streptococcus pneumoniae*.

The most common side effects reported in at least 1 in 10 adults are decreased appetite, headache, diarrhea, rash, new/aggravated joint pain, new/aggravated muscle pain, chills, fatigue, any pain/tenderness/redness/swelling/hardness at the injection site, and limitation of arm movement. Common side effects reported in at least 1 in 100 adults, but less than 1 in 10 adults, are vomiting (in adults aged 50 years and over) and fever.

The need for revaccination with a subsequent dose of Prevnar 13 has not been established.
